

## How the DAT390 report will be graded

General rule: As a basic orientation, grading on the "A" to "F" character scale is applied in line with the UHR's decision on grading master theses (see [assessment form](#) and [specification of grades](#)). This is not applied 1:1, but taking account of the status of work from DAT390; in particular, that the reports need to be shorter than master theses and that they are at an earlier stage, so that they contain preliminary results only, rather than the output from a completed research effort.

The *standard* for evaluation is the same as for a master thesis, but the scope is different; the [UHR assessment form](#) is adjusted to these circumstances as follows:

### Introduction and theory

- *Literature review and disciplinary context* (10 points)
- *Technical grounding and theoretical insight* (10 points)
- *Goal description* (10 points)

### Methods and working practice

- *Choice and justification of working methods* (10 points)
- *Good practice related to data* (10 point)

### Results and discussion

- *Preliminary results and/or feasibility demonstration* (10 points)
- *Analysis and discussion* (10 points)
- *Critical reflection and plans or suggestions for future work* (10 points)

### Form and academic writing<sup>1</sup>

- *Structure and form* (10 points)
- *Language* (10 points)

Other than those highlighted, the sub-criteria above are taken over from the UHR form. They have the same meaning here as originally specified by the UHR for master theses.

The *methodology* for the assessment also differs from that for the master thesis in that the prospective supervisor (of the master thesis) is not involved in the grading.

### **Scale for the sub-criteria**

10 points	near perfect
8 points	very good, only minimal improvement possible
6 points	good, but clear improvement possible
4 points	just acceptable for master degree standard
2 points	some value, but insufficient for master degree standard
0 points	negligible value

The odd integer values in between can be given as well (but no fractional points).

### **Overall grade table**

A:	90 - 100 points
B:	80 - 89 points
C:	60 - 79 points
D:	50 - 59 points
E:	40 - 49 points
F:	0 - 39 points
